Types of shelters (designated by Moroyama Town)



Designated emergency evacuation area/shelters



Designated emergency evacuation areas

..... Locations to evacuate to and to protect lives from imminent danger of disaster.



Designated evacuation shelters

..... Facilities in which evacuees can take shelter and spend a certain period of refugee life when disasters occur.



Welfare evacuation shelters

..... These are secondary shelters for the elderly, disabled, expectant mothers, infants and other people who need extra care when living in a shelter, and are opened on an as-needed basis.

Important points when evacuating

- These are the locations to evacuate to when disasters occur or are likely to occur. Make sure to check designated shelters close to your house and workplace for flood, earthquake and other types of disasters on this map.
- Some facilities and designated areas are located within the flood expected zones. Be sure to check the situation of the site when evacuating.

Tips for Living in Shelters

Important points at shelters

When major disasters occur, many people will be forced to evacuate and to live a communal life at the shelter. The town will assemble teams of officials in each facility that will work as shelters to establish shelter function. The initial operation of the shelter will be mostly run by the officials, then it will be handed over to a cooperative management between the town officials, facility managers and the evacuees.



Crime prevention

Shelters are not the perfect living environment. Keep in mind that you should protect yourself, and report to the police or person in charge at the facility if you see a suspicious person.

Protect privacy

Living with a large group of people could be stressful and leave you uneasy and sleepless. Protect each other's privacy by setting up partitions, etc.

Measures to prevent economy-class syndrome

Keeping the same posture in shelters or cars could lead to Economy-class Syndrome. Remember to take sufficient water and exercise moderately.



Flow of shelter establishment

Shelters are established in phases regarding the scale of the disaster and the damage condition of buildings. Be sure to utilize the latest information provided by the town.

Storm and flood disasters

(1) The first shelters to be established when disaster is expected are as follows.

For landslide disaster

- Comprehensive Park Gymnasium
- With Moroyama (Welfare Center)

For flood disaster (river overtopping, etc.)

- Chuo Community Center
- Moroyama Town Museum of History and Folklore

(2) Elementary and junior high schools

Established considering the scale of the damage and flood condition.

(3) Welfare evacuation shelters

Established when evacuee life is expected to lengthen, etc. in order to accommodate persons requiring special care and consideration.



Earthquake

(1) The preparation to establish designated evacuation shelters will be commenced when an earthquake with seismic intensity higher than lower-6 occurs in town. If you feel in danger, take temporary shelter at the designated emergency evacuation areas (outdoor) nearby or at the assembly hall, etc. that are designated in each region, and check on shelter establishment information provided by the town.

(2) Welfare evacuation shelters

Established when evacuee life is expected to lengthen, etc. in order to accommodate persons requiring special care and consideration.

Evacuation for pet animals ~Points the owners should be prepared for~

Pet-accompanied evacuation must be done in accordance with the rules of each shelter. Keep distance from the space where other evacuees live, and owners must take responsibility in taking care of the animals by keeping them tied to designated areas or put in cages you brought.



Preparation in the event of disaster

Be considerate to people around you, since there could be a variety of people at the shelter who don't like animals or are allergic to them.

Training and health care for pets

Have them get used to cages and carrying bags, and train them so that they can excrete in a set place. Be sure to get them vaccinated and exterminate parasites.

Preparing emergency goods and stock pile for pets

Prepare food, lead and carrying bag, and other goods that will be necessary to keep them in advance and bring them when you evacuate. Relief supply for pets may take longer to get to the shelter, it would be safe to have 5 days-worth (more than 7-days, if possible) of goods.



Points you should know when evacuating

There are no designated evacuation sites for each region

Use a safe and easily accessible shelter and evacuation area.

Home evacuation

Those who live in safe zones, consider the option of home evacuation (or vertical evacuation to the second floor or higher when flooding).

Evacuation to relative's and friend's house

Consider evacuating to places other than town-designated shelters, such as a friends' or relatives' house in a safe region.
