

Email distribution and telephone

Moroyama Town has started a service for its residents to provide information from the disaster prevention administrative radio system through email distribution and telephone response. This service allows residents to refer to the contents of the disaster prevention administrative radio broadcasting through email distributed to pre-registered email addresses or through an automated telephone response system.

Also, note that fire-related information broadcast under remote control by Nishi-Iruma Wide-area Firefighting Union and the daily-scheduled broadcasting (e.g., students' leaving school notice) are not subject to the email distribution and telephone response service. Fire-related information is available through the disaster information guidance service (049-280-4333) operated by Nishi-Iruma Wide-area Firefighting Union.

How to register email distribution system



Send a blank email to t-moroyama@sg-m.jp

- (1) Access the website by reading in the 2D code above, and send a blank email.
- (2) Upon receiving "Completion of temporary register notification" with an URL for definitive registration, access the definitive registration site and follow the guidance to finish registration.

Confirm information via email

Emergency Alert Email is a service to simultaneously distribute "Earthquake Early Warning" distributed by JMA and "Disaster and evacuation information" by national and local public entities to cellphones in specific areas.

* Email address registration is unnecessary, will be automatically received if cellphone is compatible (no communication, monthly, or information fees necessary).

Things to Take with and Keep Stock for Emergency

Prepare and inspect on daily basis so that you can take them with you in times of crisis.

Things to keep stock for emergency (example)

☐ Sanitary items

☐ Contact lenses and eyeglasses

Stock enough goods to sustain for a few days (3 days at least, 7 days recommended) until recovering from the disaster.

Batteries

(prepare extra)

- Drinking water standard amount
- (3L/person/day is the estimated □ Water storage tank, etc.

Emergency food



- ☐ Rice (Processed quick-cooking type comes in handy) Canned and retort foods

- Pickled plums, seasonings, etc. Dried food, candies, chocolate



☐ Tabletop stove Gas cartridges

☐ Solid fuel

☐ Backpack



- ☐ Domestic water (store in bathtub, etc.) Blankets, sleeping bags, toiletries, etc. Cooking utensils (pots, kettle, etc.) ☐ Buckets, various outdoor equipment, etc.

Prepare for home evacuation with circulative stockpiling!

Circulative stockpiling is the method of keeping a certain amount of food and other goods in stock on regular basis. Buy a little extra of food and other goods regularly, eat older ones first and make additional purchase of what you have consumed. That way, the stockpile won't go to waste and you can eat the food you are used to as emergency food during the time of disasters.

Keep stock of the food you are used to!
